- ³ in which appears His wisdom in disposing all things, funchangeableness, power, and faithfulness in accomplishing His decree;
- ⁴ and God has, before the foundation of the world, foreordained some men to eternal life, through Jesus Christ, to the praise and glory of His grace;^j
- 5 leaving the rest to act in their sin to their just condemnation, to the praise of His justice. k

4. CREATION AND FALL

- ⁴ Satan using the subtlety of the serpent to seduce first Eve, then by her seducing Adam;^e
- ⁵ who without any compulsion, in eating the forbidden fruit, ^f transgressed the command of God, and fell; ^g
- ⁶ whereby death came upon all his posterity, ^h who now are conceived in sin, ⁱ and by nature the children of wrath, ^j the servants of sin, ^k the subjects of death and other miseries in this world, and for ever; ^l
- ⁷ unless the Lord Jesus Christ set them free.^m

12. CHRIST, ORDAINED AS MEDIATOR AND MADE A SACRIFICE FOR SIN

¹ Concerning His mediatorship, the Scripture holds forth Christ's call to His office; for none takes this honour upon Him, but He that is called of God as was Aaron;^a

³ all of mere free and absolute grace towards God's elect, ^e and without any condition foreseen in them to procure it. ^f

¹ This office to which Christ is called is threefold: a prophet, ^a priest, ^b and king. ^c This number and order of offices is necessary,

³ in respect of our great alienation from God, we need His priestly office to reconcile us;^e

⁴ and in respect of our averseness and utter inability to return to God, we need His kingly office to convince, ^f subdue, ^g draw, ^h uphold i and preserve us to His heavenly kingdom. ^j

15. CHRIST IS PROPHET

- ¹ Concerning the prophecy of Christ, it is that whereby He has revealed the will of God, whatsoever is needful for His servants to know^a and obey;^b
- ² and therefore He is called not only a prophet^c and teacher, ^d and the apostle of our profession, ^e and the messenger of the covenant, ^f but also the very wisdom of God, ^g in whom are hid all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge ^h who forever continue

³ in whom are hid all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge, ^h who forever continues revealing the same truth of the gospel to His people. ⁱ

- ³ and removed all rites and shadows etc.^g and is now entered within the veil into the holy of holies, which is the presence of God.^h

- ² and is stable and perfect, not for a time, but forever, ^c which is suitable to Jesus Christ, as to Him that ever lives. ^d
- ³ He makes His people a spiritual house, a holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifice^e acceptable to God through Him.^f
- ⁴ Neither does the Father accept,^g nor Christ offer^h to the Father, any other worship or worshippers.

19. CHRIST IS KING

- ¹ Concerning His kingly office, Christ being risen from the dead, ^a and ascended into heaven, ^b and having all power in heaven and earth; ^c
- ² He does spiritually govern His church^d
- ³ and does exercise His power over all, ^e angels and men, good and bad, ^f to the preservation and salvation of the elect, and to the overruling and destruction of His enemies. ⁱ
- ⁴ By this kingly power He applies the benefits, virtue, and fruits of His prophecy and priesthood to His elect,^j
- ⁵ subduing their sins,^k preserving and strengthening them in all their conflicts against Satan, the world, and the flesh,^l keeping their hearts in faith and filial fear by His Spirit.^m
- ⁶ By this His mighty power He rules the vessels of wrath, using, limiting and restraining them, ⁿ as it seems good to His infinite wisdom. ^o

- ² These only have interest in Him, ^e and fellowship with Him, ^f for whom He makes intercession to His Father in their behalf, ^g
- ³ and to them alone does God by His Spirit apply this redemption; ^h
- ⁴ as also the free gift of eternal lifeⁱ is given to them, and none else.^j

- ² by which faith they come to know and believe^d the truth of the Scriptures, ^e and the excellency of them above all other writings, and all things in the world, ^f
- ³ as they hold forth the glory of God in His attributes, ^g
- ⁴ the excellency of Christ in His nature and offices, ^h
- ⁵ and of the power and fulness of the Spirit in His workings and operations; ⁱ
- ⁶ and so are enabled to cast their souls upon His truth thus believed.^j

23. THE PRESERVATION OF ALL WHO RECEIVED THIS FAITH

- ¹ All those that have this precious faith wrought in them by the Spirit can never finally nor totally fall away, ^a seeing the gifts of God are without repentance; ^b
- ² so that He still begets and nourishes^c in them faith, ^d repentance, ^e love, ^f joy, ^g hope, ^h and all the graces of the Spiritⁱ unto immortality; ^j
- ³ and though many storms and floods arise, and beat against them, yet they shall never be able to take them off that foundation and rock, which by faith they are fastened upon;^k
- ⁴ not withstanding, through unbelief, ¹ and the temptations of Satan, ^m the sensible sight of this light and love be clouded and overwhelmed for a time; ⁿ
- ⁵ yet God is still the same, ^o and they shall be sure to be kept by the power of God unto salvation; ^p
- ⁶ where they shall enjoy their purchased possession;^q
- ⁷ they being engraven upon the palms of His hands, r and their names having been written in the book of life from all eternity. s

- ¹ Although the particular congregations be distinct and several bodies, every one as a compact and knit city within itself;^a
- ² yet they are all to walk by the same rule of truth;^b
- ³ so also they by all means convenient are to have the counsel and help one of another, ^c if necessity require it,
- ⁴ as members of one body, in the common faith, under Christ their head. ^d

- ³ and that we are to witness to the truth of the Old and New Testament unto the death, if necessity require, ^c
- ⁴ in the midst of all trials and afflictions, as His saints of old have done; ^d
- ⁵ not accounting our goods, lands, wives, children, fathers, mothers, brethren, sisters; yea, and our own lives dear unto us, so we may finish our course with joy; ^e
- ⁶ remembering always that we ought to obey God rather than men; ^f
- ⁷ who will when we have finished our course, and kept the faith, give us the crown of righteousness;^g
- ⁸ to whom we must give an account of all our actions, and no man being able to discharge us of the same.^h
